Subject: Association of Rumanians in Austria

1. On 10 October 1953 the Association of Rumanians in Austria called a meeting in Salzburg for the purpose of electing a committee, as required by their statutes.
2. The Iron Guardists from Salzburg, who had been boycotting this organization from the beginning, especially among the Volksdeutsche, suddenly decided to enroll in the organization en masse, demanding the right to participate in the forthcoming election. This decision was made as the result of visit (Father) MUELLER made to Salzburg on 5 October 1953. Father MUELLER advised the Legionnaires to undertake an "infiltration action" in the organization for the purpose of taking over the Association of Rumanians in Austria, using well known Legionnaire tactics which were employed in Rumania 16-18 years ago when all student organizations were seized by them. For this purpose Father MUELLER donated to the Iron Guard approximately 10,000 Austrian schillings.
3. The Legionnaires concentrated all their available forces in Austria on 10 October for the purpose of dominating this meeting, and even brought about twenty persons from Linz. One hour before the start of the meeting the Legionnaires and their sympathizers blocked all entrances to the meeting hall, threatening all those suspected of being against them.
4. It was under these circumstances that Josef HENZ, President of the association, arrived at the meeting. Sizing up the situation he called the police, who permitted members and non-members alike to enter the meeting. Encouraged, the Guardists took all the strategic seats in the hall, while a good number of the members of the association left the meeting. The late comers did not even enter.
5. On their own initiative, the Legionnaire leaders began giving speeches. The most forceful of all was the Legionnaire commandant, Vasile MAILAT, who first discussed the activities of Petre CONSTANTINESCU, whom they consider the founder of the Association of Rumanians in Austria. MAILAT stated that CONSTANTINESCU had recently been arrested, and he gave a brief sketch of the nefarious activities with which he was charged. He then switched his talk to the subject of the sixteen Rumanians arrested for espionage, and stated that the capture of these men was the result of a betrayal "originating out of Salzburg" When [] entered the meeting hall MAILAT was saying, "Yes, we are the Iron Guard and we are proud to be the Iron Guard because our shirts are splashed with blood. We are ready to give our life for the Iron Guard." MAILAT further made the statement that, "We are supported by the Americans".
6. After MAILAT finished his speech he was followed by Mircea BARBULESCU, Leonte COJOCARU, and Traian PUIU, all of whom spoke less vehemently.
7. Dr. LEONHARDT, a Volksdeutsche, also spoke, in German, praising the Iron Guard.

MEMORANDUM

SUBJECT: MAILAT, Vasile

1. The files of this office reveal the following information which may possibly pertain to the subject of your request.

2. Chief of Station, Karlsruhe forwarded to Chief, FIM, a report in which an informant disclosed his knowledge of various organizations engaged in intelligence operations in Rumania and Austria. The following information pertaining to one Vassile MAILAT was extracted from the report;

"Vassile MAILAT, a collaborator of AUNER and SIMA, lost a large number of bodies in Rumania over the past three years, and... (informant) says that with the exception of a few connections still remaining in the Banat at Floesti and Gluj, the SIMA group is largely non-existent."

3. A report on the intelligence activities of Rev. Ion Florian MUELLER, which was prepared by [] was forwarded to Chief, EE by Chief of Station, Frankfurt on 4 April 1952. [] reported that according to [] Vasile MAILAT, a Legionary Commandant and former mayor of the 3rd Sector of Bucharest under the Legionary regime in Rumania, was, at the time of the report, the present Legionary chief for Austria. [] also reported that during a meeting between MAILAT and [] on 8 January 1952 in Rev. MUELLER'S presence, MAILAT stated that "individual Legionnaires had been assigned to work for the various allied intelligence services, but that no service could boast of using the services of the Iron Guard Movement". [] (MMA-9074); Source: [] Evaluation: Not given/.

4. Included in a list of Rumanians most active in politics abroad was one MAILAT, fnu. This list, dated December 1948, indicated that MAILAT, an Iron Guardist, was in Austria. [200-7-34-5y (H-100-125)]; Source: [] Evaluation: B-2/.

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- (2)(A) Privacy
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5. The following information was extracted from a dispatch from Chief, FDM to Chief of Station, Vienna, dated 14 February 1949:

"...We have been informed by a source believed reliable that Professor Vladimir PETROVICI, formerly of the Faculty of Law, University of Bucharest, escaped clandestinely to Austria in December 1948. He was taken in hand by the Salzburg office of CAROMAN, the Rumanian relief organization which has headquarters in Paris. CAROMAN in Salzburg reported to the Paris headquarters that PETROVICI is an Iron Guardist and that the Iron Guard wishes to keep him under cover in Salzburg to work for MAILAT and other Guardists 'who are compromised'..." [200-7-34-12 (MAVW-955)].

6. A report on the activities of [] dated 7 January 1952, was forwarded to Chief, FDM from Chief of Station, Karlsruhe. The report indicated that the Legionnaires, through Vasile MAILAT and BARBULESCU, were using blackmail against [] concerning the publication of the Vestitorul. It was also indicated that the Legionnaires had published three issues of the Vestitorul without [] participation. [62-6-2-344 (MIMA-8070)]; Source: [] Evaluation: Not given/.

7. In a report from Chief of Station, Karlsruhe to Chief, FDM, dated 12 October 1950, it was indicated that one AUNER, fnu was a ZIPPER employee. It was further indicated that one Vasile MAILAT was a co-worker of AUNER. [32-6-1-2781 (MILA-3659)].

8. One Ioan BALCU was included in a list of Rumanian emigres suspected of Communist affiliations or sympathies. Information on BALCU, dated 10 January 1951, was given to source FAIRFAX by the CAROMAN agency in Paris. Additional information on BALCU, supplied by CAROMAN, indicated that one Mr. SASSU, who was formerly employed at the Rumanian Legation in Prague, confirmed that BALCU, while in Bucharest, had the attitude of an active Communist, that he was aggressive and openly menaced Minister FILOTTI. In a personal file on BALCU, which is kept in the CAROMAN office, it was indicated that BALCU had given as a reference one MAILAT, fnu, in Salzburg. 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9. Chief, FDM, received from Chief of Station, Karlsruhe a report on the debriefing of [] dated 29 August 1950. The following excerpt concerning MAILAT was taken from the report:

".... [] stated with surprise that Emil CHILEZAN is in constant correspondence with Vasile MAILAT. MAILAT, a Legionary Commandant and a former very Orthodox Legionary, plays now the part of a bourgeois Legionary. He seems to have forgotten completely the basic Legionary rules of austerity and plays this part very well. Both he and his wife are good bourgeois. [] does not know if the part which MAILAT plays as a bourgeois is genuine or has been suggested to him by the Legion. The fact is that he has not broken off from the Legion and still considers himself a Legionary.

MAILAT and his wife live at 5 Moosstrasse, in Salzburg.

[] thinks that he works for AUNER...."

10. Information on one Petre BOGDAN aka Titi CONSTANTINESCU dated 14 March 1951, was received from the U.S. Army Attache, Ankara, Turkey. The information was given to the Army Attache by one Dr. Aurel DECEI who had received it from one Victor LEU, the Archimandrite of Free Rumania. According to Chief of Station, Karlsruhe, LEU was considered a questionable character, and was, probably beyond question, a British agent. The following was extracted from the report:

"....Constantinescu-Bogdan is presently working for the 'American Intelligence Service in Austria', in the Auner Group. (Auner is a Saxon from Brasov, Rumania.) Auner formerly worked for the Hitlerite services and during the war, he left Rumania. Most of Auner's assistants - among which are Mailat, Dimitriu, Baciu and others - are former Iron Guard members...."

11. Chief, EE, in a dispatch to Chief of Base, Salzburg, dated 22 May 1952, requested information on one Gora BOTAZZI. It was indicated that a woman believed identical with BOTAZZI had been in Salzburg in August 1951 and had been in contact with various Rumanians, one of whom was Vasile MAILAT. [6-6-2-4925 (MASW-433)].

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12. A report on the activities of one Tanda CARAGEA BRAGADIRU MOEVS was submitted by Chief of Station, Karlsruhe to Chief, FDM on 4 January 1952. The following information was extracted from the report:

"...Overtly, the Iron Guardists use injurious language whenever Subject's (MOEVS) name is mentioned and accuse her of being a Communist agent, of having betrayed them, etc. Covertly, however, Subject is on very good terms with a number of Iron Guardists and especially with Vasile MAILAT and Mircea DIMITRIU, both of whom she often meets...."

[] (MGMA-8044); Source: [] Evaluation: Not given.

13. Chief of Station, Vienna forwarded a report on one Father Florian MUELLER to Chief, FDM, on 15 February 1951. Information on MAILAT was extracted from the report as follows:

"...NEAGUYE (sic) prefaced his remarks by saying that although neither Father MUELLER nor Walter POPAN will officially admit contact with each other and with the Horia Sima group of the Iron Guard (Legion), they definitely all work close together on political and intelligence matters.

Father MUELLER's closest collaborators in Austria are Mircea DIMITRIU, Marin SANDU, Mihai GIUREA, Vasile MAILAT, Traian GOLEA and a (fnu) CONSTANTINIU. All of these men are key figures in the local Horia Sima group and DIMITRIU, GIUREA and MAILAT are known to have political and intelligence connections with the French in Innsbruck...."

14. A CIC report on Iron Guard personalities in Western and Central Europe, dated 16 January 1950, was forwarded to Chief, FDP by Chief of Station, Trieste on 18 August 1951. The CIC report indicated that one Vasile MAILAT, residing in the U.S. zone of Austria, was working with the American IS. [62-7-2-68 (PTTA-1696); Source: CIC, Trieste; Evaluation: by CIC, the entire report, F-6; by the Trieste Station, the above information, 2.]

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15. George NEAGOY, in a report on his activities in Austria from August 1947 to July 1951, indicated that Vasile MAILAT was a member of the Auner-Malner group of Horia Sima's Iron Guardists. The report also indicated that the Auner-Malner group, which was working for the American IS, was loyal to Horia Sima first and to the Americans second. In general, the report indicated that the American IS set-up in Austria, as far as Iron Guardist participation was concerned, was a sorry mess which was principally due to internal strife within the Iron Guard group. [62-7-2-72; Source: George NEAGOY; Evaluation: Not given].

16. On 28 March 1952 [] reported on the reorganization of the Iron Guardists in the Salzburg area. The Guardists organized themselves into three "Nests", which in the Legionary organization is the equivalent of the Communist "cell". Vasile MAILAT was indicated as being the Legionary Commandant of the "Command Nest". [62-7-2-78 (MOMA-9154); Source: [] Evaluation: Not given].

17. Chief of Station, Karlsruhe forwarded a report on Dr. John Florian MUELLER to Chief, Munich Operations Base on 10 October 1951. The following was extracted from the report:

"...Included in Karl files information is a Vienna memorandum (NASA-264) which reports that MUELLER's closest collaborators in Austria are Mircea DIMITRIU, Marin SANDU, Mihai GIUREA, Vasile MAILAT, Traian GOLEA and a fru CONSTANTINIU, all key figures in the local Horia Sima group, and DIMITRIU, GIUREA and MAILAT are known to have political and intelligence connections with the French in Innsbruck. He also has close ties to Iron Guardists in Spain, to Swiss Intelligence, and to French intelligence...."

[6-8-5-28 (MOKA-33424)].

18. Acting Chief of Station, Karlsruhe forwarded a report on Titu CONSTANTINESCU aka Engineer BOGDAN to Chief, FDM, on 2 December 1949.

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The following information concerning one Vasile MAILAT was extracted from the report:

"...He (CONSTANTINESCU) sought to reestablish contact with and regain the confidence of the SIMA group in order to be able to recruit couriers for Rumania from among members of that group. That group's confidence in Titi CONSTANTINESCU had been shaken because of the misunderstandings which had developed in Salzburg between CONSTANTINESCU on the one hand and Mircea DUMITRIU and Vasile MAILAT on the other hand. DUMITRIU and MAILAT had been appointed by Horia SIMA to lead the Legionary group which had infiltrated the American IS in Austria, i.e. Linz and Salzburg. CONSTANTINESCU had sought to obtain that appointment for himself from Horia SIMA. That caused a conflict between Titi CONSTANTINESCU on one side and DUMITRIU and MAILAT on the other as a result of which Titi CONSTANTINESCU withdrew from the SIMA group in Salzburg so far as his activity went, for a certain period. During that interval DUMITRIU and MAILAT exerted pressure on CONSTANTINESCU for rejoining the SIMA Legionary group in his activity in order to end the evident competition between them and to avoid weakening their standing and their relations with the American services in Salzburg.

19. Included in a list of names of Rumanian personalities known or suspected to be members of the Intelligence and Security Services of the Rumanian Government or of the Communist Party of Rumania was one Vasile MAILAT. It was indicated that MAILAT was suspected of having Rumania IS affiliations. Date of information was 18 February 1947. [62-8-2-1yl (MAVA-1465 Atchd to MAVA-525); Source: ODI, USFA Report No. R-35-48, information from ODI, USFA files; Evaluation: B-2].

20. A dispatch from Chief, FDM, to Chief of Station, Vienna, dated 6 December 1948, was a report on the trial of Eugen TEODORESCU who was charged by the Rumanian Government as acting as paid agent in the service of the information service of the American Army. The following information concerning MAILAT was extracted from the dispatch:

"...According to the Act of Indictment, information for the Americans was to be transmitted through MAILAT and BOROBARU (believed to be identical with Vasile MAILAT of G-2 Summary of Rumanian Intelligence and Security Services, page 16, dated 30 September 1947, attached to MAVA-525; and with Traian BOROBARU, member of the Rumanian National Government in Vienna in 1945), close collaborators of Horia SIMA."

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21. On 30 December 1949 Chief of Station, Karlsruhe forwarded to Chief, FDM, a report written by [] on the Legionary Movement from its beginning in 1919 to present. The report indicated that one Vasile MAILAT was one of several Legionnaires who had fled from Rumania to Germany with Horia SIMA after the Rebellion of January 1941. [62-7-2-16y9 (MGMA-1997)]; Source: [] Evaluation: Not given/.

22. A member of the Iron Guard who escaped from Rumania in May 1948 submitted information on the organization of the Iron Guard to [] who transmitted it to Washington in March 1950. Date of information was January 1950. It was indicated that one Vasile MAILAT was an Iron Guard courier in Salzburg. [62-7-2-18y1 (PGA-4750)]; Source: [] Evaluation: B-3/.

23. The following information concerning one Vasile MAILAT, which was originally in the EE/FI/ZIPPER office, was taken from unprocessed material which is to be placed in file No []

"MGL-A-429 - Rumanian lawyer, 40 years old. Has his Abitur and is a licensed jurist from the Univ. of Glnj. Was a 1st Lieutenant of the Rumanian Reserve (artillery) and practiced law in Bucharest until fall 1940 when he became District Bürgermeister of Bucharest. In Jan. 41, emigrated to Germany and was in Buchenwald KZ until Aug 44. Since 1945 has been in Austria working since then as leader of a debriefing team. Subject speaks Rumanian, French, and German; knows Rumania very well. Due to past political activity, has far-reaching contacts in Rumania and to legionnaire circles of emigrants. Has been thoroughly investigated and is considered to be very responsible, capable, correct, and clever. Leader of this operation, and also runs operation in Project 121. Sub-agents report to him once a month by letter, he sends reports to Austria via mail in secret writing; Subject known by [] Subject knows the leader of Organization 13 and the representative as well as the co-workers of the head Residentura 15000. Subject knows that he is working for a German Intelligence agency which has U.S. support. Subject appears in Proj. 121 in the same capacity which he has in this project." (Deval. Proj. 14-21 Sept 49)

"MGL-A-489 (Project 121 - 1 Oct 49) Co-worker of Organization 13 where he led debriefing group beginning in the summer of 1947. Recruited #15325 and trained him in positive intelligence, secret writing and codes. Family, if any, probably lives in Austria. Paid as regular member of GVA (ZIPPER)."

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"MIL-A-2446 10 July 1950. Leader of the project; Rumanian national born 1909 in Bucharest; living with wife, but not in contact with his family in Rumania; while in military service attended Officer's Candidate School for Artillery in Craiova. Up to 1941 member of the Legionnaire movement and member of Rumanian Bar. At present no political affiliations. Has organized and carried out several missions into Rumania for General Agency A."

"MIL-A-9352, 30 Nov 51. Dropped Agents List 456/30. Unfit for employment.

ACCUSED: I cannot know this for sure. I learned from DRAGOS HOINIC that he was in touch with AUNER that he was the courier and carries this information and gives it to MAILAT. I ~~only~~ knew from a discussion with attorney NEGULESCU.

PRESIDENT; Why did you go back to Salzburg?

ACCUSED: I resided ther and was to report what I had done in Rumania. I had to inform HORIA SIMA through Vasile MAILAT. Vasile MAILAT worked with the American Information Service. He had had contacts with MALNER of Austrian Origin, who had connections with the American Information service.

3. a. "URSU", #15 050. Rumanian Lawyer, 40 years old. Subject has his Abitur and is a licensed jurist from the University of Cluj. He was a first lieutenant of the Rumanian Reserve (artillery) and practiced law in Bucharest until fall 1940 when he became (see MGLA-430, para. 1-2). In January 1941 he emigrated to Germany and was in Buchenwald KZ until August 1944. Since 1945 he has been in Austria working at various jobs, and in the summer of 1947 he became a co-worker of ODEUM and has been working since then as leader of a debriefing team. Subject speaks Rumanian, French, German, and knows Rumania very well. Due to his past political activity, he has far-reaching contacts in Rumania, and to the Legionnaire circles of emigrants. He has been thoroughly investigated and is considered to be very responsible, capable, correct, and clever. He is the leader of this operation and also runs operation in project # 121.

4. All of the personnel concerned in this project are alleged to be either Hungarian or Rumanian nationalists who are eager to work against the Soviets. Material interests are preponderant where smuggling activities on the border are concerned. URSU lives in Austria, but all the other personnel live behind the curtain and we do not yet know enough about them to go into the question of control deeply. URSU's subagents report

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to him once a month by letter, and he in turn sends reports to Austria via mail in secret writing. It is not yet known what method of writing the sub-agents use.

5. [] knows URSU and #15 012 (not yet identified), who schooled him in intelligence work. He also knows URSU's safe house. He knows that URSU is in contact with some U.S. Intelligence agency. The sub-agents assume that they are working for legionnaires who are working with emigrant groups. Who knows whom among the sub-agents is not known except as already stated.
6. URSU knows the leader of Organization #13 and the representative as well as the co-workers of the head Residentura 15000. He also, of course, knows []
- URSU knows that he is working for a German intelligence agency which has U.S. support.
7. URSU appears in Project #121 in the same capacity which he has in this project.

THE FOLLOWING EXCERPT IS QUOTED VERBATIM:

In order to solve the general conflict which they had caused and so that they might become the undisputed masters of the Rumanian state, SIMA and PATRASCU, and their immediate and devoted followers, organized the Rebellion of January 1941 especially with the Septembrist members. The first consequence of that bloody act was the assassination of a great number of men- primarily jews - looting, destruction of property, etc.....

The second consequence was the assassination of a large number of Legionaries, the arrest and the sentencing to prison terms of a still greater number of Legionaries, who were accused of serious political crimes. The third consequence was the flight once again, to Nazi Germany of Sima, Patrascu, N. Stoicanescu, Traian Borobaru, Vasile MAILAT, Mircea Dimitriu, Ilie Smultea, Eugen Teodorescu, from the " group of friends devoted to the commandant", although Germany simultaneously supported General Antonescu officially and openly so that he might restore the political situation in Rumania.

They all agreed to meet in Salzburg at a later date to discuss the practical details (evidently so that in the meantime MAILAT might ask for instructions from the Legionary Command). At the Salzburg meeting MAILAT proposed that [] continue to work on the Information section of the paper and prepare an article on the Armistice of 23 August 1944 for the first issue. [] refused to write the article on the grounds that enough had been written on the subject already. MAILAT also agreed to submit all the material for the paper to [] before turning it over to the printer. For a time, following this meeting, [] received numerous letters and telephone calls from MAILAT, who was trying to convince him to write the article, without success.

The Legionnaires, through MAILAT and his assistant BARBULESCU have already sent some material to the printer for "Vestitorul". They also have sent circular letters to all their sympathizers among the Rumanian refugees everywhere, inviting them to send articles for publication in the "Vestitorul" and address them to BARBULESCU in Salzburg. BARBULESCU lives in Salzburg, in the apartment which was formerly occupied by Professor Vladimir PETROVICI.

Vasile MAILAT lives in Salzburg. He worked for AUNER and seems to be working for someone at present, too, as he is interested in gathering intelligence information and prepares files. One of his main agents in Intelligence work is Mihail GIUREA, son of Dr. (fnu) GIUREA of Bucharest, who was also a Legionary. Mihail GIUREA's aliases are Engineer Mihail and DRAGOMIRESCU. MAILAT's letter drop in Salzburg and in Freilassing, Germany, is Sandu MARIN, who is the legal tenant of the wooden hut on Elizabethstrasse 38, in Salzburg (known among Rumanian refugees as the "Rumanian Home".) MARIN lives in this hut, and occupies a room in the center of Salzburg and lives at Freilassing, too, where he uses the German Post Office Box #48.

The Rumanian element in Salzburg is composed of 95% Iron Guards of the Horia Sima faction. It is common knowledge among the Rumanian group that the Iron Guardists are working for the American I S. Their operation, and their meeting places are known to practically all of the Rumanian group. The Auner-Malner groups which is composed of Vasile MAILAT, Mihai Giurea alias Dragomirescu, Sandu Marin, Constantinuc, Mircea Dimitriu, Traian Golea, Basiu (fnu), have made no bones about whom they are working for. I personally have brought to the attention of the TIB American delegate that the above mentioned group is loyal to Horia Sima first and to the Americans second. It has been brought to my attention, without confirmation, that a large part of the funds or monies that this group receives for their services is sent directly to Horia Sima for support of the Legionnaire movement. Another faction working for the Auner-Malner group is one Titi Constantinescu alias Peter Bogdan, Mircea Popa and Costica Baci. This above mentioned group are split from the group previously mentioned. Working with the same people (TIB) but do not get along harmoniously because of different political views. It is said that at the beginning of 1948 or 1949 Bogdan chided in personally with the Mailat group but at the present time are at odds with each other. There is no cooperation between the two groups, in fact, not only lack of cooperation but even to the extent of opposing each other or causing each other difficulties.

The Mailat-Giurea group has always been a terrorist group among the Rumanian element in Austria. Instead of being an aid to the refugees who have come through, on the contrary they have terrorized them into being interrogated and debriefed and in turn submit these reports as though they were obtained from operatives going into Rumania.

1. The danger of SHEKEL exploitation of Allied support for political ends is indeed a factor to be considered in our use of SHEKEL agents, and we concur fully with para 4 of reference dispatch. From the beginning it was pointed out to FALLIBLE and the SHEKEL Committee that our operational activities with them in no way reflected Allied support or sanction of their organization, and if they attempted to make political ammunition of this collaboration, it would cease immediately.

2. Prior to the Bucharest trials there was practically no evidence of bad faith in this respect on the part of the SHEKEL Group and they constantly maintained that only FALLIBLE and the SHEKEL Committee were aware of our joint activities. Although we were hesitant to believe that at the time, we are now inclined to believe that our collaboration was known to a very restricted group of the agents themselves and the Committee. This conclusion was reached because of the nearly universal surprise in the SHEKEL rank and file when the Bucharest radio informed them that the SHEKELs were working with the Allies, and, later, the written results of the trials could leave no doubt of it. At least in Paris we have learned through independent sources that the local SHEKELs were as surprised as our independent sources at this fact.

3. Although FALLIBLE alleges to exercise a dictatorial control over his followers, we are convinced that he does have difficulty with some of the more hotheaded of his followers such as Vasile MAILAT (see reference). It is not known how soon after the trials were made public that FALLIBLE issued orders (if he did so) to his followers in Germany and Austria not to attempt to exploit the information. FALLIBLE has also admitted to us that it was only when the rank and file SHEKELs became aware of our joint operations that dissention began to grow because SHEKEL had not received official Allied recognition and FALLIBLE himself was alleged to have been at fault for not insisting on this prior to dispatching agents.

1. On 29 September, just prior to CONSTANTINESCU's arrest by the Austrian Police, Greengrocer 1 reported as follows on CONSTANTINESCU's radio-smuggling for the Yugoslav IS:

a. Peter CONSTANTINESCU @ BOGDAN, born 29 September 1910, living at Auerspergstrasse 25/II, Salzburg, is supplying the UDBa with radios for Yugoslav agents. CONSTANTINESCU has already supplied 46 radios, four of which he delivered personally to UDBa agents in Deutsch-Goritz.

b. The radio sets are assembled in Strobl, Land Tyrol, by Johann ~~XOPITZ~~, Strobl-Aigen 83, and Walter ~~MUELLER~~, Villa Salvetta, Strobl 184, who use a workshop belonging to the mechanic ~~KRAUFNER~~ fnu. ~~MUELLER~~ was at one time an agent of the East German Republic working in West Germany.

c. CONSTANTINESCU first established contact with the Yugoslavs through Margit ~~KROSCHOPF~~ in 1952, when he agreed to work for UDBa in exchange for information on Rumanian, Bulgarian and other refugees transiting Yugoslavia.

d. Others who work with CONSTANTINESCU include:
Mihai ~~GIUREA~~, often in Graz;
Princess ~~CARAGA~~, in Innsbruck;
Mireea ~~LOPA~~, in Munich; formerly Salzburg;

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2. We have numerous traces on CONSTANTINESCU's alleged co-workers, most of whom are known for their inter-related Iron Guard activities in Western Austria. Association with CONSTANTINESCU does not necessarily mean that this group is in touch with the YIS. As indicated below, some of these persons formerly had contact with "BOGDAN, a Zipperite of the anti-SIMA Iron Guard faction". We believe this BOGDAN to be identical with CONSTANTINESCU, who was a TIB informant as of January 1951.

a. Mihai GIUREA

GIUREA was involved in a Kufire Rumanian operation as of 19 February 1953 (DIR 41551) and was at that time registered as an informant of CIC Salzburg (EASA 1030). On 25 August 1953 he travelled on an Austrian passport to Trieste, where he claimed to have been sent by Father Florian MUELLER. GIUREA stated in Trieste that he worked for the Iron Guard in Salzburg, backed by the United States and collaborating with ODENVY. (TRIS 4217). According to EGQA 10417, 17 February 1953, GIUREA is known to have political and intelligence connections with the French in Innsbruck. He was once an agent of Vasile MAILAT, working for Kurt AUNER, and has posed as a liaison officer between American authorities and the Rumanian Committee in Salzburg.

b. Princess CARAGEA

CARAGEA, a self-confessed Rumanian agent, was turned over to the French by CIC and was almost certainly working for the FIS as of July 1951. She was intimate with BOGDAN (formerly a Zipperite under AUNER of GV A), and was probably observing the AIS through BOGDAN for the French. CARAGEA told a CIC informant that she had penetrated GV A through one of AUNER's top employees, and that she had promised to help AUNER find a job with SHAPE when he was dropped by GV A. Sometime before July 1951 CARAGEA met Hermine JOSWIG, former secretary to Erich KERNBERGER, in Salzburg, offering JOSWIG 2,000 schillings for some mission which JOSWIG probably turned down. (MGLA 7499, July 1951.)

c. Mircea POPA

POPA, Chairman of the Rumanian Provisory Committee founded in Paris in 1948, worked for Zipper in Austria until June 1951, and was believed to have maintained contact with Kurt AUNER after that date (MGLA 12275, 10 July 1952). In June 1952 POPA was in contact with Margit GROSZCHOPF, and was said by CONSTANTINESCU to be investigating GROSZCHOPF for a U.S. intelligence agency (C 7567, 9 June 1952).

d. Vasile MAILAT

Former mayor of Bucharest, appointed for the projected Rumanian Army of the SIMA Government in Vienna, 1945; reportedly the second man in the Austrian organization of the Iron Guard next to SIMA (CIC report S 8458, 9 September 1946). According to EGQA 10417, MAILAT worked for AUNER as of September 1951, and was known to have political and intelligence connections with the French in Innsbruck.

RESTRICTED

e. Marin SANDU

SAMDU was reported in MASA 264, 15 February 1951, as a key figure in the local Horia SIMA group, and a close collaborator of Father Florian MUELLER, who in turn maintained clandestine contact with the Zipperite BOGDAN.

f. Traian PUIU

PUIU has previously been reported active in Horia SIMA circles; see EAVA 3149, 22 June 1953.

g. Dr. Jon ELLIAN

In 1944 WILLIAM was one of the co-founders of the "Association of Christian Rumjans in Austria", a pro-monarchist organization composed primarily of former members of the Iron Guard. WILLIAM was, and may still be, president of the association. He has moved from Linz to Innsbruck. (Vienna Embassy despatch 1868, 5 May 1953.)

h. Nikolai Izotov

LEONTE is a member of the Iron Guard organization in Salzburg. He is registered with DP authorities, and registered also as a student at the University of Salzburg. (CIC report S 8458, 9 September 1946.)

i. Spiridian NEATE

"Former book-keeper, Iron Guard police directorate in Rumania. SS-Untersturmfuehrer Horia-SIM¹ Division. Worked with US Signal Corps at Maxglan-Salzburg until December 1945. Last seen July 1946. Iron Guard contact man for transient Legionnaires passing through Salzburg." (CIC report S 8458, 9 September 1946.)

3. There are no VOB traces on Johann OPPITZ, Walter MUELLER or KRAUPNER. fnu.

4. For Salzburg: Please pass the contents of paragraph 1 to G-2, USFA. We are interested in learning the results of G-2's interrogation of CONSTANTIN NALSCU.

4. We believe that FALLIBLE and the Committee are still abiding by their agreement not to exploit the Allied support for political purposes since a change of this agreement was one of the main points of his discussions while in Paris. Although the discussions in Paris were abruptly terminated before any decision had been reached, FALLIBLE realizes he has nothing to gain by breaking the agreement since he still hopes that we will change our minds on the subject, at least to some extent. FAJO still remains the only channel through which FALLIBLE and his organization can gain access to "respectability."

5. Although we grant that when any member of SHEKEL vaunts of its connection with the Allies, whether he made his deductions from radio and press reports, or whether he was informed of this collaboration by the SHEKEL Committee, the results are equally bad. We believe, however, that since attempts to exploit this collaboration have come to our attention only since the trials, it is indicative that the SHEKEL security has been better than we imagined it. We trust the SHEKEL Committee will be able to keep their followers in line and we will emphasize this point at our next meeting.

Source: Usually reliable Rumanian emigre leader who is in contact with emigres of all political tendencies in Germany and Austria.

1. Rumanian refugees in Germany total approximately 3,400 persons of whom only about 1,200 can be considered ethnic Rumanians, the others for the most part being Volksdeutsche. The majority of Rumanian emigre organizations in Germany were created by members of the Iron Guard who have been in Germany since January 1941. Although these Iron Guardists were comparatively few in number, they were extremely active politically and succeeded in enlisting the cooperation and support of many of the Rumanian refugees who reached Germany toward the last years of the war and immediately following the war. The recent split in the Horia SIMA Iron Guardists was also reflected in these refugee organizations in Germany and the moderate Guardists of the PAPANACE, GARNEATA, and IASINSKY faction have succeeded in taking over a number of these organizations. The weakening of the control of the SIMA Iron Guardists has been favorably viewed by many non-Guardist Rumanian refugees. On the other hand, certain liberal Rumanian refugee leaders consider that this may be but a maneuver on the part of the Legionnaires and that they will eventually close the ranks again after having attained the leadership of nearly all Rumanian organizations in Germany.

Source: A fairly reliable source who obtained the information from a fairly reliable sub-source who had conversations with RACOVEANU, GARNEATA and PAPANACE, Iron Guardists.

1. Active Legionnaires in the world today, both Simists and "dissidents", number about 1,600 or 1,700. Of the 1,200 in Europe there are 700 in Germany, 150 in Austria, 150 in France, 100 in Italy and 100 in Spain. Since the break in the Iron Guard last spring, Horia SIMA now controls only a minority of 140 or 150 active Legionnaires. The "Grand Guard", or non-Simists, allegedly have control of the large majority of active Legionnaires, i.e. 800 partisans. The rest are "undeclared".

2. Out of 11 "Legionnaire commandants" only one has remained loyal to Horia SIMA - Paul TRAIAN. The four "assistant commandants", out of 27, who are still Simists are Mircea DIMITRIU, Cotavian ROSU, COSTEA and Iancu IOAN. SIMA, who apparently travels under the name of Nicolae PAUL, is reported to have a chief staff composed of Virgil VELESCU, Traian BOROBARU and Mircea DIMITRIU. DIMITRIU, who worked with Gestapo elements, Ahrens Services, lives in Paris and specializes in intelligence problems. VELESCU is the "super intellectual" of the group - political counsellor, publicist, etc., and lives in Munich. BOROBARU is the personal aide-de-camp of SIMA and has become quite involved in the adventures of the "Chief".

3. Also in the Simist command are Grigore MANOIILESCU, responsible for cultural and administrative questions; Vasile MAILAT, recently moved from Austria to Germany and specialist in police and terrorist matters. There is allegedly still a network of recruiters for missions into the country. The military advisors of SIMA are Gen. Platon CHIRNOAGA and Cdt. Constantin MATEI. These two, with SIMA and other advisors, have devised a plan of action for the future: to infiltrate Rumania, organize clandestine networks, penetrate the ranks of the R.P.R. Army, and when an armed conflict arises to join the interior revolution and thus assure their power before any other government takes over. Source was told by DRAGAN that he (D) felt he had to personally help SIMA, and not the Legionnaire Movement in general, because SIMA had been his lycee professor and he felt morally obliged to him.

4. Financial Status of Simist Group: Before the break, the Simist leaders claimed to have a monthly income of 40,000 D.M. For their printing works in Munich they received 9,000 D.M. from DRAGAN, and the printers and employees of the Institute of Culture were paid 300 D.M. per month. They

Source: A fairly reliable source with excellent contacts in Romanian emigre circles in Germany.

1. In April 1954, General Platon CHIRNOAGA, whose permanent address is Paris, France, called a meeting in Munich, Germany, of local Iron Guardists. Among those accepting this invitation were (Dr.) APOSTOLESCU, Gheorghe SLOCOVEANU, Laurian TALNARU and G. CARSTEANU. The General stated that he had called this meeting on his own initiative and that he had no orders from anyone to attempt to regroup the Guardists who were being split asunder to the profit of their enemies. However, he "personally" urged all present to rally around the "Commandant" (SIIA) and lend their support to the Liberty Front, the only activist organization for the liberation of Rumania.

2. Many of those present maintained that SIIA was trying to conceal his shameful past life by hiding behind the Liberty Front. When General CHIRNOAGA insisted on a regroupment of Legionnaires, the meeting became disorderly with Dr. APOSTOLESCU pounding on the table and TALNARU declaring that he would personally take care of SIIA if he could lay his hands on him.

3. During the discussion the General made it known that E. SIIA was recognized by certain Western personalities and he alone was the man with whom these personalities would deal. He himself (CHIRNOAGA) could testify to the good relations SIIA enjoyed with a high American personality, influential enough to bring considerable support for the liberation of Rumania. In reply, his audience stated that they knew this American personality to be (Mr.) John F. IRVING and because of his attachment with SIIA he had lost the respect of the entire Rumanian emigration.

4. Some days later, V. KILAT, faithful SIIIST leader in the Salzburg area, visited the British Zone of Germany to attempt to rally Guardists to the SIIIST cause. He met with little success and found Legionnaires in northern Germany already forming anti-SIIIST organizations.

5. On his way back to France General CHIRNOAGA held another meeting of Guardists in the Fribourg area but not with the same lack of success. The Legion Commander, Mircea ORENDOVICI, in particular, and (Lt. Col.) MIULESCU (Major) MIULESCU and (Capt.) DREVE all refused to compromise with SIIA. ORENDOVICI said he had decided to actively combat SIIA and his organization and regretted that General CHIRNOAGA was still representing him.

<p>On 12 July 1954 Informant 21-76 reported the following information which he obtained from the Austrian State Police, Salzburg, Land Salzburg, Austria. The information was obtained by the State Police following a special request from the Ministry of the Interior:</p> <p>a. (Dr.) Florian Mueller, Catholic priest, stateless, born 3 November 1910, in Constanza, Romania, was a former member of the "Iron Guard" who was arrested in 1941 and put into a concentration camp. He was liberated in 1944 and, until the end of World War II, was a member of the Romanian exile government in Germany. Currently, he is on the list of war criminals of the Romanian People's Democracy. At the end of the war he went to Sao Paulo, Brazil and in December, 1949 he moved to Salzburg where he stayed at the Nonnberg Monastery until 29 July 1953. He was assigned by the Vatican to work for the "Welfare Organization for Romanian Refugees in Austria"; however, his most important mission was to convert Romanian refugees to Catholicism and possibly to recruit them for the "Iron Guard". In order to facilitate his missionary work, the Vatican has authorized Dr. Mueller to hold religious ceremonies according to the Greek Orthodox as well as the Roman Catholic rite. On 29 July 1953, Dr. Mueller moved to Stuttgart, Germany where he carried out similar activities. Dr. Mueller is currently the leader of the Romanian Catholic Committee in Germany with headquarters in Munich, Germany. In this capacity, he comes under the supervision of the head of the Romanian Catholic Mission for Europe, Professor Jon Kirk, who resides at the Vatican in Rome, Italy and who was the former secretary to the apostolic nuncio in Bucharest, Romania.</p> <p>b. (Dr.) Vasile Mailat, lawyer, born 27 July 1907 in Bucharest, Romania, stateless, Greek Orthodox, married, residing at Maxglaner Hauptstrasse 24, Salzburg c/o (Dr.) Eugen Niedermann, was owner of a law firm in Bucharest from 1932 to 1941. He then went to Bulgaria where he was arrested by the German security police on 16 August 1941 for belonging to the "Iron Guard" and was taken to Rostock, Germany, as a forced laborer in the airplane factory Heinkel. He was then interned in the concentration camp Buchenwald in Germany where he remained until 1944. Upon his release, he went to Vienna, Austria and became an official of the Romanian exile government. At the end of World War II, he moved to Salzburg, Austria and from 1946 to 1948 he was in charge of the Romanian Committee in Salzburg. He is now the legal adviser for the Romanian Catholic Mission in Salzburg and in this capacity he has maintained close contact with Dr. Florian Mueller. Since December 1953, Dr. Mailat has also worked for the International Commission for Jurists, with headquarters in Berlin, Germany and a branch office at Lindprunstrasse 21/I, Munich, Germany. does legal work for the Romanian Institute, Hedwigstrasse 2, Munich, whose chief is Professor Gheorghe Manulescu, a brother of the former Romanian foreign minister. For his work, Dr. Mailat receives between 800 to 900 schillings per month. On 16 December 1946, he married Ilse Ludwig, born 28 April 1918 in South Tyrol, Austria, who is a USFA employee earning 1500 schillings per month.

c. Well-informed, reliable sources report that neither Dr. Mueller, Dr. Mailat nor his wife have any connections with Soviet intelligence and they avoid any contact with Eastern countries, even to the extent that they do not go into the Soviet Zone of Austria for fear of immediate arrest. Any rumors to the effect that these personalities are engaged in activities for the Soviets are thought to originate from (Ing.) Petru Constantinescu, alias Petru Bogdan, born 29 September 1910 in Buzau, Romania, Greek Orthodox, single, residing at Innsbrucker Bundesstrasse 7, Salzburg. Constantinescu especially hates Drs. Mailat and Mueller because they are representatives of the "Iron Guard". Although Constantinescu was also interned in Camp Buchenwald, he was put there not because of membership in the "Iron Guard" but because he was considered to be a spy by the German security police. Constantinescu has denounced a number of "Iron Guard" members to the present Romanian Government; for this reason, he has made several trips to Bucharest and has been working for Romanian intelligence since 1948. He also maintains contact with Yugoslav and French intelligence and allegedly with the Vatican and other intelligence organizations. He allegedly has indirect contacts with certain Austrian authorities in Vienna, Austria. Although he tried to establish contact with the German intelligence agencies, he was rejected as being one of the worst "information peddlers". Drs. Mailat and Mueller recognize Constantinescu as an unreliable person and they have warned other Romanian refugees about him. For this reason, Constantinescu has tried to harm Mailat and Mueller in every possible way.

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also reportedly received a subsidy from the Catholic Mission, through the intervention of Father MULLER, which came to 3,000 - 5,000 D.M. monthly. Horia SIMA was apparently in constant contact with the Vatican. Mgr. KIRK went personally to the Cardinal TISSERAND and then gave Father MULLER the plans for subsidizing the Movement. SIMA was in favor of the Union of Churches and furnished the actual information, while the Vatican gave financial aid and housed the persecuted or unemployed Legionnaires in the centers in Germany, Spain, etc.

5. The new Legionnaire agreement was confirmed by GARNEATA and RACOVEANU, the former stating that if the "Grand Guard" succeeded in organization, it would receive the same support from the Vatican as the SIMA group received. In regard to "operational" activity, it was said that Father MULLER publicly announced to the Catholic Youth Congress in the summer of 1954 that they should draw up teams of men dedicated to take action in the R.P.R.

6. The "Grand Guard" did not really begin to be organized until August 1954 at the time of the "secret" Congress of Munich, at which GARNEATA, LASINSKI, PAPANACE, etc. participated. Also at that time SIMA and his group held their meeting and decided to exclude the dissidents from their Movement.

7. Principles drawn up by the leaders of the "Grand Guard":

A. Outlaw the collective command and suppress the principle of "Chief". Hold democratic elections and create a council of 30 persons (headed by an appointed executive committee) comprising the most important Legionnaires.

B. Doctrinary: The new group will revert to the former line held by CODREANU, to make the Movement a "school of morale education". There would be an anti-totalitarian orientation and the interest of the country would be considered before the interests of the group. The question of collaboration with other organized groups in exile had been mentioned earlier.

8. Source considers RACOVEANU as the main inspiration for this new organization. He believes RACOVEANU has a great influence over the other elements in the Legionnaire Movement.

- There are numerous traces in Station files concerning one Vasile MAILAT, born 28 July 1907, who appears to be identical with Subject of reference. However, of these traces, dating back to February 1950, only BOCA-35652, 4 September 1958, is available at COS.
 - Station files contain carded references to the following two 1957 documents, each concerning a frau MAILAT who might be identical with Subject Ref:
 - BOHA-23009, 22 March 1957, states that one frau MAILAT, DPOB unknown, was expelled from West Germany because of "Disloyalty".
 - A trace request from the 7050th AISW, dated 3 October 1957, on one frau MAILAT, DPOB unknown, who was living at 119 Dachauerstr., Munich.
 - Station files contain a dropped card, dated August 1952, on Vasile MAILAT, born 28 July 1907, but it is not clear as to what Unit was the dropping agency. The carded reference was BOHA-15066, dated 4 September 1952.
 - Since Station files are not complete, and all or most all of the traces on Vasile MAILAT originated at Munich, we defer to Munich or Hqs. for the passing of any of the above information to the LRV.

Although Headquarters traces were not requested in reference A, reference B requested that Munich and/or Headquarters determine what information in KUBARK files, if any, might be passed to the LfV Bavaria. Since the data at Headquarters with but one exception originated with German and non-KUBARK SOURCE sources, passage as such would be in violation of the Third Agency Rule, save for SOURCE information dated 1948 and earlier. However, this information should be revealed at such time as the LfV traces UPHILL, and through traces to the other SOURCE elements at CACROZE. The one exception mentioned above appears in paragraph 6 below; yet, this item also should be revealed in the UPHILL trace. Headquarters is forwarding a resume of traces for your use, but only on an fyi basis.

2. Our records indicate that Vasile MAILAT, born 28 July 1907 in Bucharest, is a former assistant mayor of Bucharest under the Iron Guard Regime who fled Romania after the unsuccessful Iron Guard rebellion of January 1941. With other Legionnaires Subject fled to Germany, was interned at Buchenwald until August 1944, and subsequently settled in Austria; GOCAL information states MAILAT moved from Vienna to Salzburg following World War Two. During his sojourn in Austria he was an UPHILL agent, 1947 through possibly 1951. Since the early 1950's, Subject allegedly has been involved in intelligence activities for the Iron Guard, the AIS, EIS (source: ☐ ☒ B-2) and the FIS (see para 5).

3. The name of Vasile MAILAT, not further identified, appears in a list of individuals suspected of having Romanian IS affiliations, as compiled by USFA, evaluated B-2, with information dated February 1947. (This affiliation was probably based on the fact that Subject, who as of February 1947 was residing in Salzburg, had received "greetings" from a member of a Romanian Repatriation Committee passing through Salzburg at that time; the Committee member was known to be a Siguranta official and alleged liaison officer between the Siguranta and the Soviet MVD in Romania.

4. A dropped list of USFA agents records Subject as having been dropped 31 May 1951 for (unspecified) security reasons; however, there is no indication as to which element of the AIS was the dropping service, if it was not actually UPHILL. Subsequently, an GOCAL report of 15 July 1954 suggested that allegations concerning MAILAT's connections with Soviet intelligence (see paragraph 3 above) may have originated with the notorious Titi CONSTANTINESCU & Petre BOGDAN, whose personal feelings towards Subject would have produced derogatory information.
